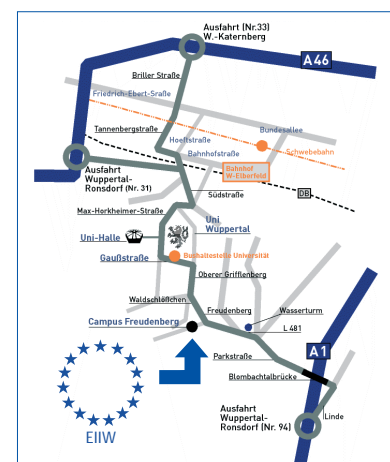

## INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVES AND CHALLENGES

Europe faces a series of challenges: the globalization of economic relations and international locational competition as well as macro-economic policy efficiency in light of the rising influence of multinational companies and banks; moreover, there is an expansion of multi-lateral organizations and international co-operation. The opportunities and problems of the information society, issues of transatlantic co-operation and regional economic integration in the EU are also crucial issues in the 21st century.

Technological progress, institutional reforms and the optimization of economic policy offer opportunities to raise the standard of living and to contribute to stability in the digital world economy. Monitoring and analyzing economic dynamics or evaluating policy options in open economies is fascinating. Learning from (optimization) models or best-practice is important for a common sustainable future around the globe.

The EIIW, a politically independent non-profit organization, is the first economic research institute in Germany which analyzes international economic problems from a genuine European perspective. This is a formidable intellectual challenge since one not only has to focus on policy issues from a national perspective but also to consider the overall EU picture and the various perceptions and interests in the Community.

The internationalization of economic relations and hence policy relations is intensifying and has increasingly attracted the attention of political decision-makers, investors, consumers/workers and NGOs. The internationalization trend as well as the emergence of new communication networks offer both opportunities and risks to individuals, regions and whole economic systems. This is the background for the research and activities undertaken by the EIIW, its researchers and the large international network of economists, many of whom have participated in the more than 30 international workshops and conferences held in 1995, the year EIIW was founded, and the following ten years.

## ANALYTICAL FOCUS AND WEBSITE

A major research focus is on the requirements for a stable and efficient international division of labor and technologies, including the integration of Eastern Europe. We are also strongly interested in issues of trade, migration and capital flows on the one hand, and, in regional integration efforts in other parts of the world on the other. Topics of real business as well as of economic policy are analyzed. An important characteristic of the EIIW is its orientation towards topics of practical relevance and an often comparative research focus.

The Institute's main analytical research fields are:

- Globalization, multinational companies and trade
- European integration and transatlantic economic relations
- Telecommunications, the information society and e-commerce
- International developments in labour markets, social security and health care systems
- Comparative analysis of the dynamics of innovation and entrepreneurship
- Macro economics, banking developments and capital market dynamics
- Environmental economics, the analysis of energy markets and infrastructure networks
- Policy reforms in market economies and North-South dialogue
- Economic policy optimization, including the development of European-specific policy proposals

Apart from self-financed projects, the EIIW also undertakes research and consulting for other organizations (e.g., for the European Commission and the European Parliament), for governments of EU member countries as well as for various companies. The EIIW aims to provide a forum for innovative and critical research and at the same time provide an intellectual bridge between the research community, the business sector and economic policymakers. ## THE PRESIDENT



Prof. Dr. Paul J. J. Welfens is the President of the EIIW. He holds the Chair of Macroeconomics at the University of Wuppertal as well as the Jean Monnet Chair for European Economic Integration. Welfens has testified before the US Senate and before the European Parliament; Welfens also has been a consultant to the IMF and has been invited to seminars both at the IMF and the World Bank. He is Managing Co-editor of the book series, *European and Transatlantic Studies* (Springer Publishing) with Robert Z. Lawrence, Kennedy School of Government/ Harvard University. He also is Managing Editor of the Journal *International Economics and Economic Policy* with Holger Wolf from Georgetown University, Washington D.C. and Jürgen Wolters from the Free University of Berlin (see [www.econ-international.net](http://www.econ-international.net)). Raised in Germany, Switzerland and France, he has a truly European background. He was awarded his doctorate (and his "habilitation") in Economics from the Mercator University of Duisburg and has previously held positions at AICGS/the John Hopkins University, the University of Muenster and the University of Potsdam.

## GUEST LECTURES – WORKSHOPS – CONFERENCES – TEACHING

During guest lectures, international experts present results from ongoing research and discuss recent developments in their respective countries/regions of origin. We welcome researchers who want to spend part of their sabbatical at the EIIW in Wuppertal – the home city of Bayer – which is located 30 minutes from Düsseldorf airport and 75 minutes (by high speed train) from both Brussels and Frankfurt.

The EIIW international workshops and conferences provide a regular opportunity for the presentation of current research and for discussion on these findings with

colleagues and partners interested in economic analysis of the scientific nature.

The results of the conferences and workshops are published in books, journals and via other media as a means of informing the general public.

*The EIIW is supported by an Academic Advisory Board whose members include economists from all around the world. The international orientation of the EIIW can be seen through its many co-operations with foreign partner institutes in Europe and the US. There is an on-going relationship with the AICGS/the Johns Hopkins University in Washington D.C., where Paul J. J. Welfens – the founding president of EIIW (\* in Potsdam 1995, in Wuppertal since 2003) – worked as a McCloy Distinguished Scholar in Residence in 1990/91. The EIIW has also collaborated with the Hertford College at the University of Oxford, the CASE institute in Warsaw, MERIT in Maastricht, ARC-Sys in Vienna and the Leontief Center in St. Petersburg.*
